### Week 1 - June 14-18

<p><b>Toddler</b> Lead: Joy Langley-Parsons (all day) Assistant: Maria Saavedra</p> <p><b>Under the Sea:</b> Children will learn about Sea Animals near and far through stories, songs, and crafts. In this camp, the children will explore many occupations or "helper" roles within the community. 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### Week 2 - June 21-25

Children will learn about zoo animals through songs, stories, and crafts. Children are required to bring lunch, snack, nap/rest items for the week (mats are provided by Pinewoods), and playground shoes.</p>	<p><b>Primary</b> Lead: Gabisu Menendez (all day) Assistant: Brandi Austin</p> <p>Arts &amp; Crafts Camp with Spanish Immersion: Arts and crafts camp will inspire kids to reach beyond and create art that is unique to them. By doing so, kids feel empowered to be creative and expressive. It's amazing to see just what kids design when given the freedom to explore and to express themselves creatively! Come join us as we explore the prismatic world of the color kittens with a combination of visual and performing art games and exercises. Children will be able to put all of their work together in an improvised performance at the end of the week, created entirely by the children!</p>	<p><b>Elementary</b> Lead: Brittany P. (PM)</p> <p><b>**AM**</b> - Ms. Brittany: Heroes, Gods, and Monsters Mythology Camp - In the mornings of this week, we will uncover some of the most famous and influential societies of early history through the stories that they told. Campers will discover the history and people of each civilization, as well as the contributions they made to the world. From architecture and archaeology, to writing and cooking, the children will be hands-on participants in learning what made each civilization unique and how they have impacted human history and society.</p> <p><b>**PM**</b> Ancient Art Make art inspired by ancient myths and legends. We will travel to different cultures and time periods to find out how and why they created art, and we will explore different methods and mediums.</p>
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## Week 4 - July 5-July 9

<p><b>Toddler</b> Lead: Joy Langley-Parsons (all day) Assistant: Maria Saavedra</p> <p><b>Down On The Farm:</b> “EE-II-EE-II-OO!!!!” Campers this week will learn about the farm animals through songs, crafts, and stories. Children are required to bring lunch, snack, nap/rest items for the week (mats are provided by Pinewoods), and playground shoes.</p>	<p><b>Primary</b> Lead: Jennifer Sewell (all day) Assistant: TBD</p> <p><b>“On the Road” Musical Adventures (morning) -</b> Students will take imaginary trips to a variety of vacation destinations. This camp is designed to utilize a child’s imagination as they learn words, songs, and solve problems. Students will enjoy daily crafts, stories and snacks. Music will be woven into our travels to the cottage, the beach, the fair and a camping trip as we create our own adventures through imaginative play.</p> <p><b>Art and Nature (afternoon) -</b> In the afternoons, students will create crafts and artwork inspired by nature. The medium of choice - nature! Sand, sticks, leaves, seashells, water, fruits and vegetables are just some of the items students will be using to create wonderful works of art. Imagination, creativity and curiosity will abound during this week of summer camp.</p>	<p><b>Elementary</b> Lead: KJ (all day)</p> <p><b>Wizarding World:</b> Calling all Harry Potter fans! Join us for a week of acting camp with a decidedly magical feel. Students will work as individuals and as teams as we act out the passwords to get into our Common Rooms, cast spells on the “Death Munchers”, and figure out how to get past the “Whacking Willow”. 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## Week 5 - July 12-16

This week, campers will learn about trains, cars, busses, and planes through songs, crafts, and stories. Children are required to bring lunch, snack, nap/rest items for the week (mats are provided by Pinewoods), and playground shoes.</p>	<p><b>Primary</b> Lead: Jennifer Sewell (all day) Assistant: TBD</p> <p><b>"Confetti Days" Musical Adventures</b> - Many traditional children's songs have been passed down from one generation to another as Play Party songs. These songs are timeless treasures of the customs of social celebrations in our musical heritage. During this camp children will experience songs and activities that represent ways that children all around the world celebrate the joy of simply being children!</p> <p><b>Art and Math (afternoon)</b> - In the afternoons, math art projects will get kids creative while also teaching them math concepts. Patterns, shapes, angles, and lines will pervade the arts and crafts of this week of summer camp.</p>	<p><b>Elementary</b> Lead: KJ (all day)</p> <p><b>Mystery Theater:</b> Who Catnapped Cleopatra's Cat? Come and join us for a week-long interactive mystery activity. Queen Cleopatra's cat, Sphinx, has gone missing, and the palace is on lock-down until he is found! This performing arts camp will focus on character development as children are cast as key players, such as the Oracle, the Royal Weaver, the Palace Gatekeeper, and many more. Only one of them is the catnapper, but the mystery must be revealed as the detectives search to answer the classical question of "Whodunnit?!"</p>
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## Week 6 - July 19-23 x

<p><b>Toddler</b> Lead: Joy Langley-Parsons (all day) Assistant: Maria Saavedra</p> <p><b>Dinosaurs:</b> Rawwwwr!! Children will enjoy learning about different types of dinosaurs through crafts, songs, and stories. Children are required to bring lunch, snack, nap/rest items for the week (mats are provided by Pinewoods), and playground shoes.</p>	<p><b>Primary</b> Lead: Jennifer Sewell (all day) Assistant: TBD</p> <p><b>“Tell Me a Tale” Musical Adventures</b> - Through storytelling, children will develop an early awareness of rhythm, movement, singing and drama. Each day features a new tale from around the world, explored through multi-instrument and multi-cultural elements. All told, it’s an around the imagination adventure of the greatest stories from Europe, Malaysia, South Africa and more! Inspire your child’s love of learning in a delightfully engaging summer music camp!</p> <p><b>Art and Science (afternoon)</b> - In the afternoons, students will explore the wonder of cross-disciplinary learning with creative science art activities. Eruption art, watercolors and oil, color mixing, and exploding art are just a few of the art science activities that will be explored during this week of creativity and curiosity.</p>	<p><b>Elementary</b> Lead: KJ (all day)</p> <p><b>A Whole New World:</b> Combining visual and performing arts, children will spend the week in small groups creating their own imaginary world. What kinds of plants and animals can be found in Stufflandia? What songs and instruments are played in the Realm of Aloria? Groups will create props, costumes, backdrops, and skits of their new, imaginary worlds to share with the rest of the class by the end of the week. 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## Week 7 - July 26-30 x

Children will enjoy learning about different types of safari animals through crafts, songs, and stories.
